

Pet 'safe' plants



This is a list of plants that are considered safe for households with pets. Note, however, that ingestion of any plant material may cause mild gastrointestinal upset. If your pet repeatedly chews plants and has gastrointestinal upset, it is recommended that plants are removed from the home or fenced off in the garden, if practical.

Note that plants with stinging hairs, thorns, prickles or spines have not been included in the list.

The list is not exhaustive and will be updated and revised as more information becomes available.

Be careful with plant names

Be aware that common names (that is, non-scientific names) may be shared by different plants. For example, the common name 'elephant ears' applies to several different species of plant. This is also the case with 'money plant' and 'umbrella plant'. Scientific plant names may also change as more refined techniques are used to establish the relationships of plants species and families.

Allergic reactions

Many plants can cause allergic reactions in people, but this usually occurs in those with repeated contact with plants such as florists, gardeners, plant nursery workers and horticulturists. Reports of allergic reactions to plants in pets are uncommon.

Information on poisonous plants is available in the HTA Guide to Potentially Harmful Plants produced by the Horticultural Trades Association (HTA) in association with Animal PoisonLine (APL) and the Veterinary Poisons Information Service (VPIS).
